### TIPS

- Always use sharp blades and scissors.
- Use alcohol swabs to carefully clean the scissors or blade of excess glue.
- Make sure hands are clean and lotion free.

## Mounting Pres-On Self-Stick Plastics

Pres-On's Self-Stick Plastic is a plastic that has acid free, high tack adhesive on one or both sides. It comes in an assortment of sizes and thickness. You can cover the plastic with fabrics, all types of paper. When using with fabric it is repositionable but paper is not repositionable. It is a very versatile product that can be used for mounting needlework, small photos, posters, magazine pictures, scrapbooking, book arts, home décor, and much, much more. It can be cut with a craft knife or scissors.

20 pt is a thin plastic that is good for layering pieces for dimensional work on cards, and scrapbooking making templates, and photo mats, and backing for small items that are stitched.

30pt is a good weight for the dimensional work done on wall hangings, miniature books, small boxes bookmarks, tags, magnets, and ornaments. It is also flexible enough to wrap or bend into shapes.

40 pt and 60 pt is a thicker plastic that is good for mounting larger size photos and mounting your needlework. It is great for making books of all sizes.

## Basic Instructions

1. Cut the fabric or paper 1/2"-3/4" wider than the plastic. If you are cutting appliqués or dimensional pieces you only need to leave about 1/4"
2. Cut the plastic to desired size using a ruler and craft knife. Score the plastic and snap apart. If you are using the double-sided plastic you have to cut through both layers of the paper.
3. Remove the liner paper. Lay the fabric/paper wrong side up on a flat surface. Lay the adhesive side of the plastic onto the fabric/paper. Turn the plastic over, pressing firmly rub the fabric/paper/photo to adhere to the plastic.

NOTE: When working with paper/photos or larger pieces sometimes it is easier to roll the photo etc onto the plastic a little at a time.

4. Turn the mounted piece over and either trim fabric/paper close to plastic or wrap the fabric/paper around the edges and secure with double-sided tape or glue. If you are mounting a photo trim the plastic close to the photo.
